## Master Affaires européennes

### **NEW** English Track in European Affairs

For the first time, students may undertake the master **Affaires Européennes at Sciences Po** in English. The masters aims to provide students with the knowledge and analytical tools needed to function effectively in the European context. The two year program curriculum is based on three semesters of progressive learning, with a first semester of **fundamental** courses, a second semester of more **in-depth** study, and a third semester of **specialisation**, either in political analysis, economy and business, or legal issues. During their last semester, students will complete either an **internship** or a **study program** in a partner university or write a **masters thesis**. This intensive and demanding masters program prepares students for careers in the European or national public and private sectors. It is a vibrant community of more than 25 nationalities with an equally multicultural teaching staff drawn from academia, research centres, think tanks, and European and national administrations, as well as professionals working in the European arena.

### ■ General Organisation and Program 2009/2011 **NEW**

#### • General Organisation

This masters aims to provide students with the knowledge and analytical tools to function effectively in the European context. The two-year-long curriculum is based on three semesters of progressive learning including compulsory courses, optional courses, research seminars, hands-on workshops, and simulation games, all taught by a multicultural teaching staff drawn from academia, research centres, think tanks, and European and national administrations, as well as from among professionals working in the European arena. In addition, students undertake a study trip and attend seminars on European careers to allow them to network with professionals and elaborate their own career plan. During their last semester, students will complete either an **internship** or a **study program** in a partner university or write a **masters thesis**. The curriculum of the masters adopts the multidisciplinary approach that characterizes Sciences Po, with a focus on political science, economics and law, but also history and the social sciences. Students will be able to join the preparatory courses for the European Competitions organised by the [CPCE](#).

#### 📅 1<sup>st</sup> semester: Fundamentals

The first semester is based on compulsory **fundamental** courses taught by well known academics. Students will attend the compulsory lectures, but also methodological courses on management tools and research skills. Students will have an active role in a seminar on European careers to allow them, at this early stage, to meet professionals and to elaborate their own career plan.

Each student joins a [collective project](#) group in which he or she will work during the entire year. The project gives students the opportunity to work in groups and experience a concrete real life experience related to their professional interests.

### 2<sup>nd</sup> semester: In-depth study

During the second semester of their curriculum, students continue to **deepen** their knowledge in the field. They take both compulsory courses and courses chosen from among a wide variety of electives.

Also during the second semester, all students take part in a simulation game that allows them to learn about the practical functioning of the EU institutions, the EU budget, and the decision making process. This is a highly engaging and rewarding aspect of the first year of the program.

### 3<sup>rd</sup> semester: Specialization

The last semester is that of **specialization**. Students will choose one of three majors: political analysis, or economy and business, or law. They will take the compulsory courses of the major and have a wide choice of elective courses or compact courses from which to choose.

The topics of compact courses are established on a yearly basis and closely reflect the latest developments in European affairs. Students can decide to take the preparatory course for the European Competition organized by the CPCE, which will count as an elective course.

### 4<sup>th</sup> semester: Practical Experience

To allow students to test their freshly acquired knowledge outside Sciences Po, we offer them the choice of an internship or study program in a partner university or the preparation of a masters thesis during their final semester of **practical experience**. The choice has to be made no later than the beginning of the 3<sup>rd</sup> semester.

The internship is situated at the very end of the curriculum to ensure students are optimally trained prior to entering the job market and to allow a smooth transition between their academic program and career. Previous students have done internships in France, all over Europe, and around the world, in both the public and private sectors.

Sciences Po has built a worldwide network of [partner universities](#), meaning that students who already have internship experience and wish to study abroad can do so in the last semester of the program.

Students may also choose to write a **masters thesis** in the discipline of one of the three majors.
